Care Quality Commission (CQC) Inspection Outcomes - Quarter 3 2017-18

The CQC is the national inspectorate for registered health and adult care services. Inspection reports are regularly produced and these are published on a weekly basis.

The CQC assesses and rates services as being 'Outstanding', 'Good', 'Requires Improvement', or 'Inadequate'. Where providers are found to be in need of improvement or inadequate, the CQC make recommendations for improvement and / or enforcement action. Specific actions taken in each case can be found in the relevant inspection report.

Where inspections are relevant to the Borough, a summary of the outcome is circulated to all Members each week. If a report is negative, an update from Adult Services is included which summarises the position in relation to service provision and any actions taken at that time.

On 14 September 2015, it was agreed that the Committee would receive a quarterly roundup of recent reports. These would be aligned with the Six-monthly Adult Performance Reports where possible.

Recent Reports

This update includes inspection reports from October to December 2017 inclusive.

Between October and December 2017, sixteen reports were published. Please note: there is a time lag between dates of the inspection and the publication of the report. In addition, where concerns are identified by CQC, re-inspections may take place soon after the initial report is published. When the outcomes are made available within the same quarter, the result of the most recent report is included in this update.

The main outcomes from the reports are as follows:

- thirteen Adult Care services were reported on (seven rated as Good [including the SBC-managed Oak Road, and Rosedale], five rated as Requires Improvement, and one rated as Inadequate):
- no reports were released on Primary Medical Care:
- three reports on Hospital/Other Health Care (one Outstanding, one Good, and one not rated).

- · There were discrepancies and gaps in medicine administration records
- · Risk assessments were not always completed or kept up to date.
- There were concerns regarding infection control, and health and safety
- · The environment was not suitable for people living with dementia
- People were not given appropriate support with meals
- Best interest decisions not adequately recorded, with limited staff knowledge
- · Some staff were in need of refresher training in dementia awareness
- Adequate standards of care were not being ensured, and care plans were not always person centred
- There were few activities available most days of the week.
- · There was insufficient managerial oversight of day to day operations
- Audits were not effective, and care records not always accurate Incidents of a safeguarding nature were not always reported appropriately
- · Actions from the last fire safety audit had not been completed

At the time of the inspection the areas of improvement identified were in relation to:

- Staff had not received training to ensure they could appropriately support people and were not always supported through supervisions and appraisals
- The system to seek and record consent was not consistently followed and MCA assessments were generic
- The service was not always caring as the provider was not ensuring the service was caring overall
- · The service was not always responsive
- The service was not well led
- Improvements needed on records e.g. kitchen, supervision and medication.
- Checks to monitor and improve the quality of the service was not always carried out and where they were, action plans were not monitored

There were three breaches in Regulations as follows:

- Safe Care and Treatment – the provider was not assessing the risks to health and safety of the service users receiving care and treatment, or doing all that is reasonably practicable to mitigate any such risks. The provider was not following

proper and safe medicine management.

- Good Governance the provider was not assessing, monitoring and improving the quality and safety of the services provided in the carrying on of the regulated activity.
- Staffing the provider was not ensuring staff received support through training, professional development, supervision and appraisal as it is necessary to enable them to carry out the duties they are employed to perform.
