To support the delivery of the national childhood obesity strategy, Public Health England recommends that takeaway premises are mapped and used alongside local obesity data to inform further licensing. In order to contribute to building a local picture, the PH Team has commissioned research of a cohort which represents levels of deprivation/affluence; gender and ethnicity from across the borough. Questions within the research include use of takeaways and cooking skills. This research will report in December 2017 and will contribute to the formulation of future work between planning and PH.	2	Based on the research described in the Dec2017 update, PH and Planning officers have begun to discuss the opportunities with regard to Takeaway Licensing policy principles. This work has been put on hold due to the work involved in Planning Officers responding to the Local Plan inspector's questions. We have gained further knowledge on the opportunities via a workshop hosted by Professor Townsend at Newcastle University. We plan to progress this further in the coming months	2/3
