# Our current model of regulation



#### Register

We register those who apply to CQC to provide health and adult social care services

# Monitor, inspect and rate

We monitor
services, carry
out expert
inspections,
and judge each
service, usually
to give an
overall rating,
and conduct
thematic
reviews

#### **Enforce**

Where we find poor care, we ask providers to improve and can **enforce** this if necessary

# Independent voice

We provide an independent voice on the state of health and adult social care in England on issues that matter to the public, providers and stakeholders

## State of Care 2018/19 - key messages




- People's experience of care is determined by whether they can access good care when needed
- Risk of being pushed into inappropriate care settings
- Increased demand and challenges around access and workforce risk creating a perfect storm

People struggling to get the right care at the right time in the right place Risk of being pushed into inappropriate care




Total 18-week waiting list size, April 2014 to June 2019

### Adult social care specific findings



Overall

80% rated good

4% outstanding

15% requires improvement

1% inadequate

- Concerns about capacity set against growing unmet need
- Staffing is under pressure with high turnover, high vacancy rates and a lack of people with the right skills
- Continued uncertainty about long-term funding

#### State of Care recommendations 2018/19



- Action from parliament, government, commissioners, providers and communities for:
  - more and better services in the community
  - innovation in technology, workforce and models of care
  - system-wide action on workforce planning
- Long-term sustainable funding for adult social care

#### **Service composition at 31 January 2020**


83 active locations, comprising:

# Issues arising



- Some excellent practice evident, e.g. outstanding services.
- Medicine management (especially DCAs)
- Turnover of staff, especially managers and senior staff
- Recruitment, especially nursing
- Levels of provider engagement and support
- Pressure to accept packages





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
