SCRUTINY REVIEW OF HOSPITAL DISCHARGE (PHASE 2)

Summary

The next evidence-gathering for the second phase of this review (discharge to an individual's own home) will involve contributions from representatives of Five Lamps, Tees, Esk and Wear Valleys NHS Foundation Trust (TEWV) and ERS Medical.

Detail

- Based in Thornaby, <u>Five Lamps</u> is a registered charity delivering an integrated range of social, economic and financial inclusion services within which they seek to transform lives, raise aspiration, remove barriers and offer choice. This includes a Domiciliary Home Care service to people aged 65 and over within Stockton-on-Tees, as well as a free *Home from Hospital* service in conjunction with the University Hospital of North Tees for those who live in the Borough and are aged 50 and over (see link below).
