

TEWV Day opportunities for adults with a learning disability *and* autism across Teesside from

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Current provision:

- No TEWV led services within the Stockton area
- However multi-disciplinary work into;
 - Allens Way
 - Vison 25
 - Ware Street
- SaLT, OT, Physio, Dietetics – see people for therapy but also deliver staff training
- TEWV led Services for day opportunities are within;
 - Kilton View – 18 place traditional day service
 - Partner with Middlesbrough council to provide The Orchard – traditional day provision
- Mixture of health and social interventions offered

Impact of Covid -19:

- Initial closure
- Significant impact on families and carers
- Separated health and social interventions – development of a temporary outreach function
- Gradual re-opening inline with IPC guidance
- Main residual impact is those families who decline the vaccination – time taken to establish the correct IPC arrangements
- Long term change for those who reside in our health led residential home.

Future state:

- Project group in place to review current day provision
- Family carers sit on the group
- Aim of the review to consider;
 - how to modernise the service model and move away from a traditional models of care
 - How to support the varying needs of the individuals as well as the families
 - Age
 - Capacity
 - Ability to either experience, participate, or contribute
 - How can we engage and work with the community sector more meaningfully to achieve the above?
 - Use of personal health budgets
 - Transportation
- Development of an enhanced physical health team
