REPORT OF DIRECTOR OF ECONOMIC GROWTH & DEVELOPMENT

HENSHAW DRIVE, HOLYSTONE DRIVE, ROCHESTER COURT AND BLAIR AVENUE, INGLEBY BARWICK – PROPOSED SCHOOL TIME WAITING AND LOADING RESTRICTIONS SUMMARY

The purpose of this report is to seek Member's views regarding outstanding objections received following the advertising of a proposal to introduce school time waiting and loading restrictions on lengths of Henshaw Drive, Holystone Drive, Rochester Court and Blair Avenue in Ingleby Barwick to prevent inconsiderate parking causing road safety concerns and obstruction to two-way traffic flow.

1.0 RECOMMENDATIONS

It is recommended that:-

- (i) Members give consideration to the objections raised and the comments of the Director of Economic Growth & Development.
- (ii) The local Ward Councillors and the objectors are informed of the Committee's recommendation.

2.0 DETAIL

- 2.1 Local Ward Councillors raised concerns with respect to repeated driveway obstructive parking and inconsiderate parking affecting pedestrian safety associated with parents dropping-off and picking-up their children from St Therese of Lisieux Roman Catholic Primary School and Barley Fields Primary School, both in Lamb Lane.
- 2.2 The proposal was scored against priorities and has been selected for progression due to road safety and congestion concerns.
- 2.3 Henshaw Drive, Holystone Drive, Rochester Court and Blair Avenue are adopted roads which are located within an easy walking distance to St Therese of Lisieux Roman Catholic Primary School and Barley Fields Primary School. This has resulted in parents parking their vehicles in these streets at school dropping-off and picking-up times while they walk their children the short distance to/from school.
- 2.4 Site observations identified inconsiderate parking along Henshaw Drive and Holystone Drive close to the Blair Avenue junction and Rochester Court in the vicinity of the pedestrian link to the footway/cycleway that has a pedestrian entrance accessed directly to Barley Fields Primary School. Therefore, it was proposed to limit the lengths of the school time waiting and loading restrictions to these areas where the majority of pedestrian and vehicle movements take place. The restrictions will remove obstructive parking and allow two way traffic movement at the junction of

Henshaw Drive and Holystone Drive with Blair Avenue; and protect the turning head on Rochester Court. It is also proposed to amend the existing lining to prevent parking at the frontage of the Church on Blair Avenue where a new access was created. A plan of the school time waiting and loading restrictions is shown on drawing number TM2/207. **Appendix 1**.

- 2.5 School time loading restrictions are also proposed to mirror existing school time waiting restrictions.
- 2.6 "The Borough Of Stockton-On-Tees, Barley Fields And St Therese Of, Lisieux, Ingleby Barwick School Time Waiting Restrictions Order 2017" was advertised in the Evening Gazette on Thursday 29 June 2017 with the statutory objection period ending on Thursday 20 July 2017. Following publication of the statutory Notices, the Director of HR, Legal and Communications formally received six emails (3 objections, 3 comments) **Appendix 2**.

The restrictions will assist with the safe and expeditious movement of traffic and pedestrians on the affected lengths of Henshaw Drive, Holystone Drive, Rochester Court and Blair Avenue, Ingleby Barwick.

7.0 CONSULTATION

Scheme approval has been given by the Director of Economic Growth and Development in consultation with the Cabinet Member for Environment and Transport. Statutory consultations involving advertising on site and in the local press was undertaken. This resulted in 6 (six) emails (3 objections, 3 comments) being received who have been invited to the Appeals Committee Meeting.

8.0 CONCLUSION

The proposals will prohibit the obstructive parking which currently occurs on these lengths of roads.
