# **CABINET DECISION**

### **SOCIAL CARE CAPITAL PROGRAMME 2006/2007**

### 1. Summary

This report is to inform Members of the known Social Care Capital Programme for the financial year 2006/2007.

Funding is recorded under five main headings; <u>Single Capital Pot Formula allocations</u> from Government, <u>Mental Health Capital Resources</u> to support Mental Health developments, <u>Information Management Capital Funding</u> to support the development of Information Technology infrastructure, <u>Corporate Resources</u> allocated to fund Adaptations and Equipment, and finally, specific resources to support the implementation of the <u>Integrated Children's System (ICS)</u>.

### 2. Recommendations

- 1. That Members agree the Social Care Capital Programme of £677,000 be included in the Council's 2006/07 Capital Programme.
- 2. The Corporate Director for Children, Education and Social Care be authorised to approve the schemes and financial appraisals in consultation with the Cabinet Member for Adult Services and Health and the Cabinet Member for Children and Young People.

# 3. Reasons for the Recommendations/Decision(s)

To approve the Social Care Capital Programme and include in the Council's Capital Programme to enable schemes of planned replacement and improvement works to be carried out.

#### 4. Members' Interests

Members (including co-opted members with voting rights) should consider whether they have a personal interest in the item as defined in the Council's code of conduct (paragraph 8) and, if so, declare the existence and nature of that interest in accordance with paragraph 9 of the code.

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# **DETAIL**

1. Set out below are the Department of Health allocations of SCE ®, Supported Capital Expenditure (Revenue), previously called Credit Approval for the financial year 2006/2007.

As in previous years, Single Capital Pot allocations to Local Authorities are distributed according to a national formula.

The Mental Health element is distributed nationally to local authorities on the basis of each council's proportional share of the Younger Adults Relative Needs Formula (RNF) (with a floor applied).

### **Schemes**

The Single Capital Pot resources (£127,000) are to be utilised to provide the core capital funding for Chronically Sick and Disabled Persons Act (CSDPA) Adaptations and Equipment. These resources will be supplemented by the additional Council funding of £250,000 detailed below, giving a total budget of £377,000.

The Mental Health allocations will fund the development of Day Service facilities.
