It was asked whether prisons had been involved in the schemes. There had been some contact with local prisons and there might be an opportunity to link them with the lead providers.			
The Communities Fund has led to a Lone Parent campaign which is being supported by Tristar Homes. It was suggested that the scheme could be linked to an SDAIS scheme working in the same area.			
Private Sector Stock Condition Survey – Headline Findings A presentation was given by Ed Diment of CPC Ltd. CPC were commissioned by Stockton, Hartlepool and Darlington Councils to carry out a Private Sector Stock Condition Survey. The headline findings for Stockton-on-Tees were presented. Headline findings included: It is estimated that 10,700 private sector properties in the borough are non-decent. The estimated cost to remedy all non-decency is £42m (£3,900 per dwelling). The estimated cost to remedy fuel poverty is £20.3m. It was noted that there is disrepair in all sectors however it is higher in the private sector. It was asked whether there was any evidence of people using their surplus Local Housing Allowance to take on a 'hard to heat' property. There was no evidence to suggest this. From April 2010, claimants will no longer be able to keep any of the surplus (currently up to £15) if the LHA they receive is higher than their rent liability. For those already in receipt of LHA this reduction won't apply until the anniversary of their claim. It will only affect surpluses, and will not produce rent shortfalls.
