10 Investment priorities

RH distributed a 'draft' spreadsheet that gave a high level overview of NHS resource that will be allocated to programmes to address the priorities outlined in the Strategy. It is not a comprehensive review of investment requirements as there are some schemes funded from Teeswide programmes / or are funded recurrently from existing resource.

RH went through the following aspects of the budget:

- Alcohol Treatment has been funded recurrently (to address the Alcohol Strategy requirements)
- Teenage Pregnancy contract has been funded for a further 9 months to align with the review of Teenage Pregnancy Services
- Additional mental health schemes have been prioritised due to CAA focus and Mental Health Needs Assessment.
- Further obesity schemes will address the range of adult / child and family services focusing on the key recommendations of Healthy Weight, Healthy Lives in particular Specialist Weight Management Services.
- Targeted to work to address some of the performance issues including smoking in pregnancy and cancer.

 JB requested information from the PCT on the priority around carers. MP assured JB that carers were reflected in the PCT

The Board agreed to the priorities as outlined.

11 Healthy workplace update

Strategy.

SL gave a presentation – The North East, Better Health At Work is the first regional workplace health award in England. It was launched in January 2009 and 10 local organisations achieved bronze level in the first year (with 93 regionally); the majority of these are proceeding onto silver level. We are currently recruiting for new business to come onto bronze level. The Board discussed aspects of the scheme and noted it was an excellent free resource to support workplaces.

The board approved and supported the scheme and agreed to promote the programme where possible.
