Health and Well-being		
AT informed that she has not heard anything from Health and Well-being for sometime.

Creative Industry		
TC informed that he had recently attended another Thematic group meeting, which focussed on the creative industry of last year. The group member representing Digital City received bad reaction when he stated that anybody good at creative industry should move out of the Teesside area.		
JD highlighted that Tees Valley and Stockton should be the primary areas, however, it appears to be purely Stockton mapping.		
JD felt that a strategy and a plan needs to be focussed upon to support creative industry.
