5. Major Redevelopment Scheme Update a. Town Centre Development Iain Robinson informed the Board that Stockland are still in negotiations with a food supplier for the West precinct Refurbishment works on the external fabric of Block 10 (Barclays Bank block) are now complete and works are due to start on Block 11 (Town Centre Manager block) shortly although a date is still to be set. The refurbishment of the former Kwick Save site willalso start in October 2010. Stockland are looking into the provision of temporary public toilets in a vacant unit although details are still to be confirmed. The spiral ramp walkway remains closed but a contractor has been appointed and a date for reopening is to be agreed but will likely to be by November this year. b. Billingham House Tim Gibson informed the Board that they are continuing to speak to Python properties, however other options are being investigated to elevate the issue and hopefully afurther update will be provided in four to six weeks. 7. Proposed Aldi planning application Simon Plumb from Aldi informed the board that they had submitted a planning application to SBC to build a food store on the land adjacent to the Causeway and Finchale avenue. A summary of the plans and the outcome from the public exhibition were circulated to members.	
A query was raised as to why this particular location and not within the new town centre? Simon informed the board that they really wanted to have a site in the Billingham area to complement the other Aldi stores in the borough. They have had discussions with Stockland in the past but there was nothing suitable. Discussions with Stockland have resumed since the public exhibition. The new food store site in the town Centre will be three times the size of this Aldi proposal and the former Kwick Save site is also not suitable for their requirements however there was another site between Argos and the forum which previously was not suitable but they are looking at this again.	
This particular site is as close to the Town Centre as possible and does match their requirements i.e. size, car parking space etc. and they feel that people would park there and dual shop at Aldi and within the Town Centre.

A query was raised as to whether they would improve the walkway into the town centre to encourage their users to shop in the small local shops within the Town Centre. Simon informed the board that it was part of the plan but nothing has been agreed yet.	
A query was raised on the opening time of the store and their policy on selling alcohol. Simon informed the board that the times would roughly be 8am to 8pm Monday to Saturday and it would be open for six hours maximum on a Sunday say 10am to 4pm but this would need to be agreed. In terms of alcohol they would sell a mix on Beer, Cider and spirits and that it would all be own brand. They are extremely diligent on the sale of alcohol and have a challenge25 policy. All their employees have training and they don't employ anyone under 18 in their stores.	
A query was raised as to Stocklands position on the application. Simon noted that they did not know however Aldi had to provide a lot of information in the planning application and that after 21 days they will receive feedback from the council. Which may include Stocklands thoughts on the plan.	
A query was raised as to the support from local residents for the proposal. Simon responded that they had wrote out to 900 households and business in the area asking about the proposal and that a public exhibition was held however they are aware that not everyone has commented. However it was noted that there was a 15% response rate with over 80% supportive of the proposal.	
The Chair raised the issue of the number of HGV's as it was stated at the public exhibition that this would be only be one per day, and looking at the plan the lorry would have to swing round in the car park. Simon informed the board that it would only be one HGV and that the car park had been designed so that it could accommodate the vehicle manoeuvring into the loading area.

The chair informed the board that a letter had been received from Stockland on the proposals and that it was their

intention to object as they felt it could jeopardise the Town Centre Redevelopment.

In the interim a letter will be sent to Stockland inviting them to the next board meeting to discuss their proposed objection to the Aldi site and to have an update on the Town Centre.
