ECONOMIC CLIMATE UPDATE REPORT

Following the report to Cabinet in December 2008 a regular update of the local economic climate was requested to be reported to each Cabinet meeting. The following is a summary of the positive and negative economic changes that have taken place since the previous October update.

EMPLOYMENT AND BUSINESS

ENGINEERING/MANUFACTURING/CHEMICAL

Positive

- **Darchem Engineering** of Stillington has welcomed news that the contracts for two new aircraft carriers will continue and are expected to run until 2014.
- Billingham-based **Pearson Harper** has won a £6.25m contract, initially for 3 years, with oil & gas company, Chevron. The contract will initially create 20 jobs, taking the workforce to 55.
- Lucite International has announced its new £20m chemical plant will be located in Billingham. The site, which will create up to 24 new jobs, has been supported through a £250,000 grant from One North East.
- **PD Ports** has won the Supply Chain Partnership Award at the annual International Freight Weekly awards, highlighting their port-centric strategy.
- **Harvest Energy** has taken over the former Biofuels Corporation plant at Seal Sands and announced a ten-year deal to stay on Teesside. Of the 38 staff made redundant in November last vear. 16 have now been re-instated.
- **Stainton Metal** of Teesside Industrial Estate has won a contract for two of the largest street lighting Private Finance Initiative (PFI) contracts in the country, worth more than £8m each.
- Billingham-based Mammoet (UK) has won a third Olympic contract. The specialist lifting
 engineers has started work on the Aquatic Centre, where it will provide two, 500 tonne cranes,
 used to put in roof trusses.

Negative

- **Spectrum Access**, Scaffolding Erectors and hirers based on Portrack Grange Road has been placed into administration. 31 staff have been made redundant and the company is working with Job Centre Plus to offer support.
- **Update**: national building company, **ROK**, based at Preston Farm, have entered into administration. At this stage, it is unclear the exact number of jobs at risk, however, it is expected to be in the region of 90.

SERVICE SECTOR/RETAIL

Positive

- Car Wash and valeting business, Bespoke Valet and Detailing, based at David Lloyd Health &
 Fitness club, who have received a start up grant from Stockton Borough Council, have invested in
 a system that saves up to 2.5 million litres of water a year.
- Online Directory company, Touch Local, is expanding its business directory call centre operation at Preston Farm creating 100 new jobs, after winning a series of contracts and £151,000 funding from One NorthEast.
- A number of units have been let on a temporary basis in Wellington Square to sell seasonal products in the run-up to the festive period.
- Sign-maker company, N-Sign, based on Maritime Road has signed a deal with leading retailer, Lakeland, to supply its latest environmental invention, which is manufactured out of recycled materials.
- **Driver**, a global construction consultancy, has expanded its operations by opening an office in Yarm.

• **Update**: **The Maple Care home**, based in Ragworth, is set to open after creating 50 jobs. It is hoped that many of the jobs will be filled by those who have benefited from the services provided through Stockton Council's Communities Fund.

- The total number of people on JSA increased for the third month in a row, although the levels are very low, with Stockton seeing a 0.34% increase in October.
- The number of claimants continues to decrease on a national level, by a further 1.58% in October.

- The number of new JSA claimants has considerably increased across all areas in the past month, with the largest increase seen in Stockton (28.6%).
- The UK has seen a 17.6% increase in the number of new JSA claimants since the same period last year.

- There were 1,432 vacancies notified in Stockton in October 2010, 243 more than in August 2010 including 276 in Public Administration, Health & Education, 775 in Banking, Finance & Insurance, 228 in Distribution, Hotels & Restaurants, 23 Construction jobs and 47 Manufacturing jobs.
- The increase in vacancies in October is largely attributable to the high number of seasonal vacancies advertised.

Stockton had 936 unfilled vacancies in October 2010, 165 in Public Administration, Health & Education, 500 in Banking, Finance & Insurance, 158 in Distribution, Hotels & Restaurants, 9 Construction jobs and 34 Manufacturing jobs.

SUPPORT FOR PEOPLE

 A drop in event organised by Stockton Riverside College is being held in their Stockton High Street shop on 17 November between 10 am and 2 pm, and is aimed at supporting people getting back into work.

SUPPORT FOR BUSINESSES

- Business & Enterprise North East (BE-NE) has announced plans for a major re-structure, which
 could result in the loss of 135 jobs (a third of its total workforce). The announcement is preempting an anticipated reduction in the size and resources to some of the services operated by
 BENE, particularly Business Link.
- In addition to this BENE have also announced changes to support offered to 'pre-start' customers, with support now only available to those identified as having 'significant growth potential'. Businesses that cannot demonstrate significant growth potential will be able to apply for funding for 'start-up support' once they have started trading.

ECONOMIC SUPPORT MEASURES

HOUSING AND DEVELOPMENT

KEY STATISTICS

• The statistics below show key data from the Housing Service and Stockton District Advice and Information Service and compares them with previous data. Housing Options restricted its service during part of October due to the increasing demands on it from residents, which has led to a decreased number of approaches in October. As from 15 November it has changed the way it provides its service (which will be reviewed after four weeks) to deal with the increase in service. A general walk in service operates from 8:30am – 1pm. New and current clients that require "temporary accommodation tonight" are seen between 1pm and 4pm (3.30pm on Fridays). Customers that do not require accommodation that night their full details will be taken and they will be either offered an appointment or given the options to return the following morning.

STOCKTON BOROUGH COUNCIL RESPONSES

- Tees Valley Local Enterprise Partnership (LEP) has been granted approval by Central Government: one of 24 proposals from across the UK, it is the only North-East bid approved at this stage, although go ahead has been given for the creation of a North East Enterprise Partnership.
- Global Enterprise Week in Stockton, taking place from 15-19 November, has a programme of 25 events, across 17 locations in the Borough. The December report will provide a full evaluation of these events.
