JD explained that, due to the length of time it has taken to be signed off, parts of the document are out of date. The matter has been raised with RK and it was agreed to 'let the document stand' as not to delay the Strategy any further.		
JD advised that any comments regarding the Culture Strategy should be forwarded to RK, who will relay the comments back to other Authorities.		
The group referred to the Culture Strategy felt that the first two sections of the document appeared 'bland', however, recognised that Section 3 contains all the case studies, which gives a good insight into what is happening in the Tees Valley area.
