A Children's Centre Team who deliver a wide programme of activities for pre-school children through a network of 11 Surestart Children's Centres across the Borough. Most of the Children's Centres are run by the Council, however private sector providers are involved in delivery at some centres and delivery the Layfield service entirely. The Educational Improvement Service (0-11 team) who ensure quality and challenge to all Early years provision in schools (including maintained nurseries); ensure and support quality in learning development to all settings in the borough and also provide qualified teachers and advisory teachers to support development of childcare staff and plan and deliver learning development programmes in Children's Centres. The local authority works with a range of partners to deliver the function, including the NHS Stockton-on-Tees and a range of community and third sector organisations.

The proposed change to the Service is that we target the Service to provide a more targeted service in defined areas in the Borough. The Borough has been divided into 7 areas, of which 4 have been defined as target areas. The BME data collected via the census has been mapped to these areas and is shown below:

(T)Central East = 1% of the population in this area are from a BME community (T)Central South = 0.5% of the population in this area are from a BME community (T)Central West = 0.2% of the population in this area are from a BME community (T)Eastern = 0.1% of the population in this area are from a BME community Northern = 0.2% of the population in this area are from a BME community Southern = 0.5% of the population in this area are from a BME community

Western = 0.3% of the population in this area are from a BME community

(T) = Target area

64% of the BME population in the borough live in one of the 4 target areas of the Borough

An increase in focus of the provision in the target areas would therefore coincide with a focus on the areas of the Borough with the highest proportion of the BME population

The Census data also indicates that 69% of the people in the Borough claiming disability living allowance live in one of the target areas.
