He also explained that the hearing was scheduled in the high court in London for the 17th and 18th August to hear the case around the judicial review, initiated on behalf of the owners of the building.  On the 23 <sup>rd</sup> August the court ruled in favour of the council decision to demolish Billingham House. Bizzy B's application for leave to appeal was also refused by the deputy high court judge. In October 2011, a written application by Bizzy B to apply for leave to appeal was refused. In accordance with the court procedure rules, Bizzy B have now applied for an oral hearing to reconsider their application for leave to appeal and that hearing date has been set for 20th January 2012. Further details will be provided as soon as they are available.
