<p>8. Local Account Consultation The purpose of the Briefing Note is to advise the voluntary community sector of the Council's intention to publish a Local Account for 2011/12, detailing the performance of its adult social care services, to detail the role that the VCS will increasingly play in the development of this annual report, o gain some initial views on the Council's proposals. The way that Council adult social care services are assessed is changing. Previously the quality and performance of services has been judged by the Care Quality Commission, based on a programme of external inspection and regulation. Now, a sector led approach is being promoted which will be underpinned by rigorous self-assessment alongside a process of peer challenge, support and review. A key part of these new arrangements will be the production of a Local Account. Each council will be required to publish an annual report based on a self assessment of how its adult social care services have performed. As a part of this self assessment councils will have to demonstrate how they have responded to the views of local people. In this way the Government is seeking to promote transparency regarding the effectiveness of local services, whilst ensuring that local people are engaged in the process of service improvement. The Council is looking to meet the new requirements by piloting the development of a Local Account for 2011/12. There is nothing to say what the structure and content of these performance reports should be, so Stockton-on-Tees Council is working with other local councils to identify what works best. The Stockton-on-Tees Council Local Account will adopt the branding '<i>Are You Being ServedWell?</i>' This is in recognition that the first report will build on existing ways of engaging local people in improving local services. The report will detail how the Council has responded to the feedback received on services during 2011/12. This will be collated from a number of sources including work with user led organisations, special events, surveys, performance indicators and comments/complaints. The report will seek to assess the progress that the Council has made in improving services in its four key priority areas for adult social care: Carers, Personalisation, Prevention and Early</p>		Noted

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<p>Intervention and Safeguarding. This assessment will include the lessons learnt during the year and detail plans for any further service improvements. It is planned that a working draft of the Stockton-on-Tees first Local Account will be available by the end of July 2012, with the final document being published in October 2012. The views of local people about local services are central to the Council's ability to assess how its adult care services have performed. The VCS has a vital role in securing these views. The first report will outline how the existing sources of feedback, previously outlined, have promoted improved services. However, for the 2012/13 Local Account, the Council will be seeking to ensure that process of publishing the report becomes an integral part of the Council's engagement strategy ('Let's Get Engaged'). A user based Readers Group will assist the Council with the presentation of the 2011/2012 Local Account and there will be an opportunity for organisations to comment on a draft prior to publication.</p>		Noted

Community Fund Update The Western Area Partnership Board and Tees Achieve are holding an event on Friday 1st June at Challoner House for local residents to get involved in making their own planter and another for any resident who is unable to attend.
