ADULT SOCIAL CARE STRATEGY FOR CHANGE AND IMPROVEMENT

1. SUMMARY

1.1. This report presents the Adult Social Care Strategy. This non-statutory strategy sets out how the Council will deliver change and improvement in adult social care 2017 - 2020, to deliver Council Plan priorities.

2. RECOMMENDATIONS

2.1. Members agree the Adult Social Care Strategy for change and improvement.

3. DETAIL

- 3.1. This non-statutory Strategy sets out:
 - a. The vision, context (strategic and operational) and objectives for Adult Social Care across Stockton-on-Tees.
 - b. How we work individually and in partnership (internally and externally) to meet Care Act 2014 requirements and meet assessed social care needs.
 - c. How we are working towards greater integration with Health.
- 3.2. The detailed strategy is attached at **Appendix A**.
- 3.3. The following points are made in summary:
 - a. This strategy sets out the strategic vision, context (strategic and operational) and objectives for Adult Social Care across Stockton-on-Tees for the first time.
 - b. It identifies how adult social care operational activity relates to the Council's strategic aims and objectives.
 - c. It shows how people and communities are at the heart of all that is done by Adult Social Care in Stockton-on-Tees, individually and in partnership (both internally and externally).
 - d. It demonstrates the past and future importance of integrating adult social care with health.
 - e. It provides a clear framework for prioritisation and action in individual and partnership based service planning and workforce development.
