Bullying: A definition.

Behaviour by an individual or group, usually repeated over time, that intentionally hurts another individual or group either physically or emotionally.

## Anti-Bullying Action Plan - Meeting the Requirements of the Stockton Charter

Implementing reporting strategies/procedures to ensure community members feel safe. Ensure actions from recorded incidents are monitored and evaluated 4. Communicates feedback to everyone who has been affected regarding their concerns on bullying and deals promptly with the issue. All those involved will work together to uphold the anti-bullying policy. Implementing procedures for reporting back to all community members regarding concerns or complaints. 5. Seeks, learns and shares from anti-bullying good practice elsewhere and utilises the support of the Local Authority and relevant organisations when appropriate. To actively seek support from relevant local/national agencies and sharing good practice as appropriate.
