The presentations covered the role of the 0 – 19 service, family action and family hubs and outlined some real-life experiences and issues being noticed on visits, case studies highlighting the issues and intervention/ support provided, and how the 0 – 19 service was seeking to break health inequalities related to poverty.

The key issues highlighted and discussed were as follows:

- Increasing financial pressures on families
- Transport costs were becoming a huge issue and preventing families from, for

example, keeping health appointments which reinforced the need for basing services and support in accessible locations

- The importance of exploring the reasons for the problems being experienced by families rather than making assumptions or judging
- The importance of prevention and having a universal offer
- SEND may be a result as well as a cause of child poverty
- Members commended the contributors for their valuable work and for the way that all the various agencies were working together

Tracey Herrington (Thrive) gave a presentation covering the following areas:

- The role of Thrive and the Stockton Poverty Truth Commission.
- Principles of working with people who live in poverty and socio-economic disadvantage

The key issues highlighted and discussed were as follows:

- The importance of recognising and taking account of lived experience
- The benefit engaging with community groups such as Thrive
- Members were encouraged to take part in The International Day to end poverty which was Monday 17 October 2022
