2020- 00198446	<u>Use of Proceeds of</u> <u>Crime Income to fund</u> <u>Heroin Assisted</u> <u>Treatment Programme</u>	The PCC is asked to approve that the continuation and development of the Heroin Assisted Treatment Programme is funded from the income that is received from the confiscation and recovery of money from criminal activities in line with the Proceeds of Crime Act. The PCC is also asked to approve that the allocation of the ARIS monies, including the Earmarked Reserve, to be invested in the HAT programme are to be negotiated by the OPCC, taking account of arrangements negotiated in respect of Partner contributions and approved by the PCC CFO.	06/03/2020

2020- 00198652	Working with Middlesbrough Council to invest in Automatic Number Plate Recognition (ANPR) sites	The PCC is asked to authorise that the £110k of funding for this proposed investment can be accepted from Middlesbrough Council and then invested in the ANPR system as set out within this document	06/03/2020
2020- 00199814	<u>Funding - International</u> Football Tournament	Justice First hold an annual multi-cultural football tournament and have requested funding from the PCC to contribute towards the event. This year's tournament is due to take place on Saturday 13th June. The significant and underpinning aim of this event is to promote community cohesion, reduce fear or crime/fear of authorities and enhance social integration between various social and cultural groups living in Teesside. 2020- 00199815	<u>Funding - Tees River</u> <u>Rescue</u>	Tees River Rescue intends to deploy an independent, inland patrol, search and rescue boat on the river Tees. The charity will provide routine public safety patrols along the 18 mile stretch of river. The boat is not designed to replace existing provision, but provide a complimentary service. The funding provided will support the purchase of equipment for the charity. (£3,700)) 13/03/2020
2020- 00194985	Funding - Show Racism the Red Card 2020/21	Show Racism the Red Card is an anti-racism education charity which looks to use anti-racism workshops to nengage young people and adults. 2020- 00199038	Funding - Appropriate Adult Service 20/21	An appropriate adult is responsible for protecting or 'safeguarding' the right and welfare of a child of 'vulnerable' adult who is either detained by police or is interviewed under caution voluntarily. Although there is no legal duty on any agency to provide Appropriate Adult provision for vulnerable adults, the PCC has agreed to continue to provide funding for this service. (£30,000)	13/03/2020
2020- 00199042	<u>Cleveland Police Cadet</u> Programme 2020/21	The Cleveland Volunteer Police Cadet programme is open to young people aged 13 to 17 years inclusive, with separate Cadet Units in each Local Policing Area, who meet on a weekly basis for two and a half hours. The programme aims to build bridges within communities, working to reduce the risk of crime and encouraging progression towards responsible adulthood, by providing a range of transferable skills to young people. 2020- 00198763	<u>Halo Service Contract</u> Extension	Specialist support for victims of Honour Based Violence / Force Marriage and Female Gential Mutaliation has been commissioned by the PCC since 1 May 2017 The current contractual arrangements with Halo comes to an end of 31 March 2020. It is proposed that this service be extended for a 5 months period from 1 April 2020 - 31 August 2020. (up to the value of £9,000)	
2020- 00212825	<u>Cleveland Anti-Slavery</u> <u>Network Funding</u> 2020/21	In 2018, the PCC commissioned support for the creation and development of a pilot Anti-Slavery Network. The purpose being to bring together key partners to collectively and collaboratively prevent, identify and eradicate Human Trafficking and Modern Slavery in all its forms. Funding for this support came to an end in March 2020, however the benefits of having such a partnership in place has been acknowledged by key partners and the PCC. The current contractual arrangements will be extended by 12 months. (£4,000)	21/05/2020
2020- 00208344	Domestic Abuse Matters Training	As a direct result of the causes for concern and other areas for improvement identified by Her Majesty's Inspectorate of Constabulary, Fire & Rescue service, the Force has committed to root and branch improvements in its approach to the handling of domestic abuse. The Domestic Abuse Matters training equips and champions professionals across the UK to help them spot the early signs of domestic abuse and understand the tactics used by preparators. (£35,000)
