The van outside the Town Hall during the festival was a good idea.

Most of the group had used the website. There were mixed views about how easy it was to use. Several of the group felt that the website was boring. There was a suggestion to have an area of the website for young people.
 Have you ever seen Stockton News? Do you read Stockton News? How useful/informative is it? How long do you keep it for? Is it enjoyable to read? Could the content be improved? Could the format/layout be improved? 	The group had all seen Stockton News and some had read it. Generally felt that the format was not good for young people – too much small text. Suggested that there should be a section for the under 16s and a section for 16 – 25s. The group liked the "what's on" and felt that there should be more about future events than past events.
