# 194 To consider the following motion which has been submitted in accordance with Council Procedure Rule 12.1 by Councillor Fletcher: -

The following motion submitted under the Council Procedure Rule 12.1 was moved by Councillor Fletcher and seconded by Councillor Narroway:

'This Council:-

- Conscious of the effect of recent changes in 'bus services (swiftly followed by a fare increase) on the lives of so many of the residents of this Borough who depend on public transport.
- Aware that the decline in 'bus patronage in the North East of England has not been halted despite the best efforts of local authorities,
- Affirming the advantages of public transport (over expanding car use) to the environment and to the reduction of traffic congestion,

- Having spent considerable sums of public money (and planning to continue to do so) on facilities for bus passengers and on subsidised bus services.
- Has received residents' complaints that low-floor 'buses are no longer running on routes on which physical adaptations have been made for them at the public expense,
- Notes that the Commons' Public Accounts Committee, \*recognising that it is difficult to turn things around in the unregulated bus market outside London, has just called on the Department of Transport to do more than stand on the touchline mildly exhorting the players to up their game;
- Notes also that the Local Government Association added that Councils outside of London were already doing everything within their power to try and encourage bus operators to run reliable services, and needed greater influence over the local bus network so similar improvements could be made; and
- Notes that the Association frequently points out to the Department of Transport the difficulty in finding enough revenue resources to support the subsidised bus routes given the heavy inflation in costs.

Therefore this Council now calls on:

a. The bus companies to play their part by providing reliable, comfortable and convenient services, giving the public adequate notice and information about changes:

#### And

b. The Government to go beyond telling local authorities to achieve, by giving them sufficient powers and revenue resources to obtain a real change for the better in their own areas.

This Council, while recognising the efforts of its officers to achieve from limited powers and resources the best they can for residents, therefore instructs the appropriate officers to:

- i. Seek a meeting between representatives of local government in the Tees Valley and Ministers to stress these points to the Government;
- ii. Implement the two-year-old recommendation of the Environment & Regeneration Select Committee, approved by Cabinet and contained in the Local Transport Plan, to establish a bus users' forum; and
- iii. Report in writing to all Members by the end of July 2006 what progress they have made.'
- Notes that the Association frequently points out to the Department of Transport the difficulty in finding enough revenue resources to support the subsidised bus routes given the heavy inflation in costs.

Therefore this Council now calls on:

a. The bus companies to play their part by providing reliable, comfortable and convenient services, giving the public adequate notice and information about changes:

And

b. The Government to go beyond telling local authorities to achieve, by giving them sufficient powers and revenue resources to obtain a real change for the better in their own areas.

This Council, while recognising the efforts of its officers to achieve from limited powers and resources the best they can for residents, therefore instructs the appropriate officers to:

- i. Seek a meeting between representatives of local government in the Tees Valley and Ministers to stress these points to the Government;
- ii. Implement the two-year-old recommendation of the Environment & Regeneration Select Committee, approved by Cabinet and contained in the Local Transport Plan, to establish a bus users' forum; and
- iii. Report in writing to all Members by the end of July 2006 what progress they have made.'

The following amendment to the motion was moved by Councillor Cook and seconded by Councillor Lupton:-

'At paragraph I) above, delete all words and insert 'The Cabinet Member for Regeneration and Transport, together with the Chair of the Executive Scrutiny Committee, prepare a statement for submission to the Local Government Association, and copied to the relevant ministers requesting their response, based upon the points contained above regarding the lack of ability of Local Authorities to exert real influence over privately owned Bus companies and seeking more powers.'

In recognition of the above, Councillor Fletcher indicated he would be prepared to support this amendment subject to the proviso that all parties would have input to the statement. A vote was taken on the amendment; which was unanimously carried.

A vote was then taken on the substantive motion and this was unanimously carried. Thanks were also extended to officers for their assistance in addressing reported user problems.

A vote was taken on the remaining motion and was unanimously carried.

RESOLVED that the substantive motion be unanimously declared carried.
