At its meeting held on 5th February 2009 Cabinet agreed a recommendation to Council relating to arrangements for the appointment of a Director of Development and Neighbourhood Services (Decision Record attached). Council were due to consider that recommendation at its meeting to be held on 4th March 2009. The position of Corporate Director of Development and Neighbourhood Services was a Key post within the Council and it was considered that an appointment should be made as soon as practicable. Having regard to this, and relevant Members' and Officers' diaries, it was considered necessary to hold the shortlisting element of the appointment on 18th February 2009 i.e. ahead of Council's consideration of the issue on 4th March 2009. This would assist in the appointment being made at an earlier stage than would otherwise be possible.

The Panel's membership, identified above, reflected a recommendation from Cabinet and consultation with political groups.

#### 35 Forward Plan and Leaders Statement

The Leader of the Council gave his Forward Plan and Leaders Statement.

A tremendous piece of news to open with was a £4,995,250 award from the DCSF's 'myplace' programme, awarded today through the Big Lottery for a youth facility described as "world class". Called the ICE Centre – the name stands for Inspiration, Creativity and Entertainment Centre – it will be built in the Tilery area to provide leisure, social, advice and learning facilities for all 13-19-year-olds and those with disabilities aged up to 25. The new centre should be up and running by 2012.

The Tees Valley city region pilot bid would go to Government on Friday, with the successful city regions announced in April. It proposed:-

- \* A joint Board between the Tees Valley authorities, the Homes and Communities Agency and One Northeast to provide strategic direction of housing, economic development and regeneration spending;
- \* Joint investment planning with partners with the partners approving project funding locally;
- \* An Employment and Skills Board, with strong employer representation and devolved powers to influence providers to meet employer demand.

Heathrow flights: Following BMI's announcement of the withdrawal of its service to Heathrow, the Joint Strategy Unit made a submission on the likely impact on this area to the House of Commons Select Committee which was studying the impact of aviation on the economy. Other actions to lobby on the issue were being examined.

Employment programme: The Tees Valley authorities had submitted a business case to One NorthEast for a two-year £2.2 million programme, developed with other business, employment and skills agencies, to fund:

- \* An initiative to provide flexible wage subsidies to help unemployed people into construction, engineering and logistics jobs;
- \* Three business and skills development managers to help employers develop job opportunities and raise skills in key sectors;
- \* Help for small firms where concerns about employees' health could put their jobs at risk, to find solutions to keep them in work;
- \* A joined-up approach to employability by various agencies.

250 people attended the Tees Valley Unlimited conference on its work at Wynyard Hall hearing a keynote speech from Local Government Minister John Healey and visiting projects in the Stockton/Middlesbrough Initiative area.

Enterprise bid: As part of a wider Tees Valley ERDF package – recently announced in the media but not yet confirmed in writing – the Communities Fund and ERDF were to fund extra support to encourage local enterprise over the next three years. Projects included an Enterprise Co-ordinator working with schools and colleges to encourage an enterprise culture amongst young people, with a grant fund for enterprise projects. Enterprise Gateways in the more disadvantaged areas of Stockton, Thornaby and Billingham would promote enterprise, with coaches and mentors providing intensive support. It was expected that the contracts would be awarded in May 2009. A further project would help small businesses overcome perceived barriers to growth, such as VAT registration.

The planning application for NorthShore was registered in February, with determination expected in May 2009.

Homezone: The shortlisted six (out of 108 original submissions) for the RIBA "Make me a Home" competition were interviewed in January, with two for a second time last month. The winner would be announced shortly. Building Design magazine had featured the project and some of the models submitted were exhibited in the Shambles before going to the Cube Gallery in Manchester. Detailed design would begin soon and a reserved matters application would be submitted in the autumn.

The second phase of the £30m Thornaby Town Centre redevelopment was nearly complete, ready for the grand opening on 25 April. The first new shops – Card Factory, Bon Marche and Peacocks – were trading well and national retailers Home Bargains, New Look, Grainger Games and Wilkinson all open this month. Some local retailers had been trading from their new units since November 2008. Appleby House was currently being demolished as part of Phase 3 with Lidl due to open on its site in August.

The library refurbishment was well under way and the Council's first Customer Service Centre was due to open there on 30th March 2009, followed by the Library itself in late April 2009 for an official opening in May 2009. The Pavilion Leisure Centre refurbishment should be complete by the summer.

Members discussed the Tees Valley City Region pilot bid and it was agreed that Members receive a seminar on the issue.
