

NOMINATIONS FOR THE APPOINTMENT OF HONORARY ALDERMEN

SUMMARY

Council is asked to give consideration to the posthumous appointment of Honorary Aldermen to Stephen Smailes in accordance with Section 249 (1) of the Local Government Act 1972.

RECOMMENDATIONS

It is recommended that:-

1. Consideration be given to conferring the posthumous title of Honorary Alderman to:-
 - Stephen Smailes
2. Subject to the above, Marie Smailes, the widow of Stephen Smailes and guests be invited to attend a future meeting of Council to participate in a ceremony during which the title will be conferred.

DETAIL

1. Under Section 249 (1) of the Local Government Act 1972 a principal Council may, by a resolution passed by not less than two thirds of Members in attendance and voting thereon at a meeting of the Council specially convened for the purpose, confer the title of Honorary Alderman on persons who have, in the opinion of the Council, rendered eminent services to the Council as past Members, but who are not current Members of the Council.
2. The Act indicates that service with predecessor Authorities would count as service to be taken into account when conferring the honour.
3. Stockton-on-Tees Borough Council has agreed that reckonable service for the purpose of conferring this title should be at least 12 years and has agreed that the honour can be bestowed posthumously.
4. Following consideration at Commemoration Working Group on 5 October 2017 a nomination has been received in respect of the following nominees, who satisfy the terms of the above criteria:-

Name	Terms of Service	Cumulative Years' Service
Stephen Smailes	1967 to 2005	38

5. If Members agree the above nomination, then it is recommended that the title be conferred at the Council meeting on the 31 January 2018.

FINANCIAL AND LEGAL IMPLICATIONS

6. There are limited financial implications associated with the cost of providing each Honorary Alderman with a framed certificate and photograph; the cost of which can be borne within existing budgets. The recommendations comply with the legislative provisions of the Section 249(1) of the Local Government Act 1972.

RISK ASSESSMENT

7. This report is categorised as low to medium risk. Existing management systems and daily routine activities are sufficient to control and reduce the risk.

8. This report is not subject to an Equality Impact Assessment as it makes no proposals for service development or policy change.
