## Scrutiny review of vulnerable older residents living at home

#### Introduction

- ▶ Focus on Victims of Crime within the Stockton Borough aged 80 and over.

#### Cleveland Demographics

#### Population of Cleveland – 564,300

- Stockton is the largest population with 195,681
- Middlesbrough second largest with 140,398
- Redcar and Cleveland with 135, 404
- ► Hartlepool being the smallest borough with 92,817

What we don't know which would be relevant to the research is the population of the borough with the age range of 80plus. The data would apply more context to the data provided.

#### Crime Context/Data

► The crime data is based on all 80year plus – DOB used for analysis 01/08/1939

- Data is for all victims within the age parameters we could not separate home/care setting etc
- Analysis is over a 3 year period.

#### Crime Context/Data

As can be seen from the data provided the significant offences highlighted are similar to those identified from PCC data.

- ▶ Burglary 28 offences
- ► Theft 58 offences
- Criminal Damage 31 offences
- ► Fraud 89 offences for the force in 12months

#### Context/Data Continued.....

From the information presented considerations are:-

- Domestic Related incidents/Crimes
- Operational Challenges Service user on servicer user cannot be investigated = safeguarding eg Domestic Incident/Care homes
- Repeat Victims

#### Current Delivery Plans

- ► Each service of Call is subject to THRIVE to assist in the initial stages to identify vulnerable victims or vulnerability within the victim.
- ► Enquiries/Investigations are allocated appropriately to suitable teams for ownership and responsibility. Specialist Teams.
- Within specialist crime departments there is the use of intermediaries to support interviews/ABE is suitable places/Special Measures – go above and beyond, Adult Services – Strategy Meetings
- Support from VCAS for Fraud Offences Friends Against Scams
- ► Herbert Protocol Missing Persons

#### Current Delivery Plans Continued.....

- ► ECINS Communication system between the police and other agencies in particular LA/Housing Used re Vulnerable persons within the community.
- Joint Agency Group JAG
- Neighbourhood Teams Identify Vulnerable Victims within their area, Call Backs, PCSO Re –visits, Risk Assessment Matrix
- Crime Prevention Officer Assists proactive and reactive work, revisits and crime prevention support – with additional work and input to agencies – NHS/Age UK
- Dementia Champions
- Public Protection Notices

#### Current Delivery Plans Continued.....

- Probationer Training awareness
- Media Releases National updates re Action Fraud/Significant reactive information/Local Scams – Mindful of Capturing the appropriate audience.
- Cleveland Connected Email System/Requirement to sign up



#### Future Service Delivery

- ▶ Long Term Plan to involve Adult services into our Children's HUBS for a Multi Agency approach which has proven to work for children.
- Victims First
- Revisit training around Herbert Protocol
- Consideration to mirror Durham around their CQC (Review further)
- Training supported by the TSAB
- Education around identifying vulnerability

#### Future Service Delivery Continued....

- Raising Investigative Standards
- Consideration for Nominated Neighbour Scheme.
- More and more elderly people remain in the home due to lack of facilities in hospitals/care home/finances etc

#### Promotion of Safety and Wellbeing

- Crime Prevention provide support across the force to promote safety and wellbeing. This is done to the elderly community in for example church halls.
- Inputs to Dementia Friends support groups
- ► Flagging within NICHE
- Media
- Referral Pathway

### Partnership Working

Evidenced throughout the presentation is the multi agency approach when dealing with vulnerable victims of crime.

Safeguarding is a primary role in policing and without the support of the statutory and 3<sup>rd</sup> sector agencies this would not be possible to its fullest in protecting our community

Vulnerability is not only supported by organisations it is also required from neighbours/support groups

#### Key Issues

- Cleveland Police do not have a benchmark for this data.
- ▶ The data is based on all 80 and older living in the area of Stockton not directed at those living in the home.
- Lack of Reporting We don't know what we don't know (Age/Communication Difficulty/Lower Expectations)
- Ability to communicate issues
- Appropriateness of Criminal Justice Process
