What is Fraud?

- fraud by false representation
- fraud by failing to disclose information
- fraud by abuse of position



- ▶ the conduct must be dishonest
- intention to make a gain or to cause a loss or the risk of a loss
- no gain or loss needs actually to have been made
- the maximum sentence is ten years' imprisonment
- More commonly referred to as scam, cheat, con, trick, swindle etc

Fraud Investigations

Economic Crime Unit

- Specialist Fraud, confiscation and Cyber Crime
- Dedicated fraud and economic trained officers

Fraud is dealt with by all teams within Cleveland Police

Call for service

- Ongoing or recent crime
- Vulnerable victims
- Known local suspects

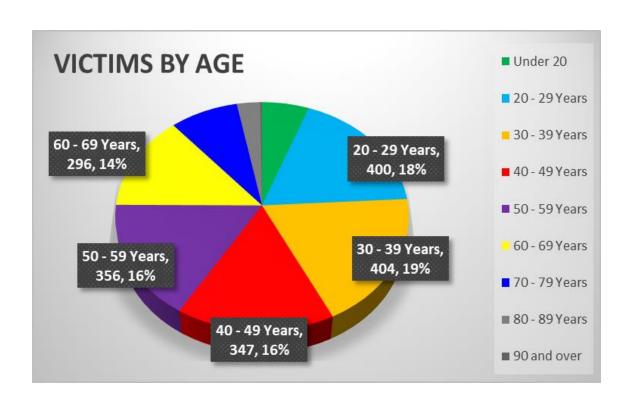
Action Fraud

- All other fraud and cyber crime
- Crime decision and record
- Provide basic victim support and advice
- Pass to National Fraud Intelligence Bureau for assessment
- NFIB disseminate out to local forces

Victim Lists?

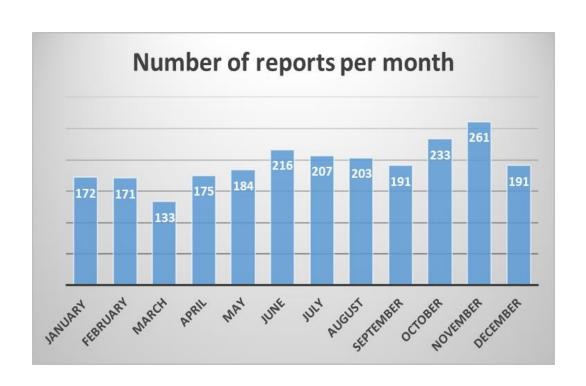
- ▶ Sent to Police forces once a week and contain details of victims and a summary of the offence reported.
- Purpose is to safeguard victims.
- Details of victims shared with VCAS who contact victims and offer support.
- Invited to a scambuster session at the CSH (pre-COVID) (Webinars now)
- Receive a letter with Fraud advice and support
- ▶ Details shared with Neighbourhood Police for contact / visit.

Who are the victims?



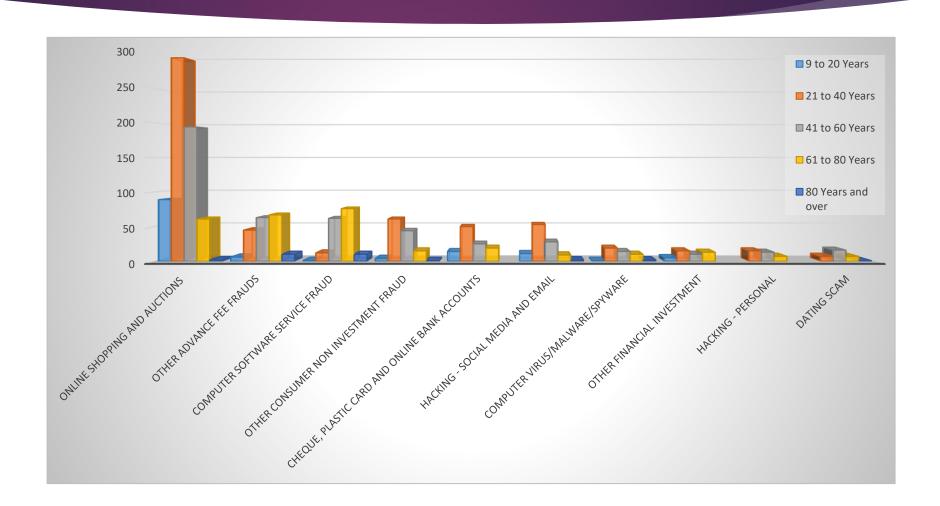
- Victims are 50% male and 50% female
- ► Fairly even spread over age groups
- ▶ The nature of the offences change
- Younger more online purchase fraud (ebay etc)
- Older more computer service fraud and courier fraud

Victims per month and by area 2020

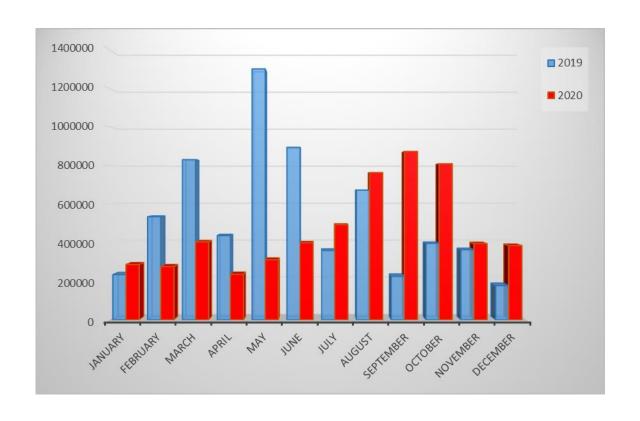


- 2337 victims reported to us via Action Fraud for 2020

COVID19 Effects

- More vulnerability through isolation
- More online activity

- Online shopping fraud increase (not just PPE)

- Courier Fraud evolved to non contact
- Romance fraud
