

- Dog fouling education / enforcement
- Animal welfare issues cruelty / abandonment / welfare offence
- Nuisance complaints relating to all animals
- Dangerous Dogs dog attacks
- Micro-chipping low cost and free micro-chipping
- Neutering low cost and free neutering
- Promote responsible pet ownership education, advice
- Animal licensing boarding / riding / pet shops etc.



Service History

- Dogs Fouling of Land Act introduced 2nd July 2001
- 7500 signs installed Feb 02 –May 03. 120 new dog bins installed March – May 02
- 120 new dog bins installed March May 02
- High profile radio, TV & Billboard campaigns undertaken, Sep 02 & Sep 03. NRF areas Nov 2005









Service History

- Dogs Fouling of Land Act introduced 2nd July 2001
- 7500 signs installed Feb 02 –May 03. 120 new dog bins installed March – May 02
- High profile radio, TV & Billboard campaigns undertaken, Sep 02 & Sep 03. NRF areas Nov 2005
- Community Wardens trained on FPN enforcement Oct 02
- Viewpoint survey July 03 & 6000 dog owner campaign Jan 04



Service Provision

- 1 x Animal Collection / Enforcement Officers appointed Aug 2002
- Further Animal Collection / Enforcement Officer appointed July 04
- July 04 officers above, patrol on a split shift system from 6.30 am through to 8.00pm Mon – Fri with an additional 9 hours of enforcement being undertaken on a weekend.



Service Provision

- Officers carry out routine patrols on ward by ward basis
- Intelligence led investigation of complaints based on information from complainants via hotline 526575
- Hot spot areas targeted via use of large temporary signs in conjunction with patrols

- Consideration regarding the adoption of Dog Control Order provisions of the Clean Neighbourhoods & Environment Act 2005 to tackle certain dog fouling issues
- Lobbying for national policy or strategy with lead taken by central government, i.e. national campaigns
