Timescale for Review

Acute Service Provision

Stockton Borough Council's view was referred to the Secretary of State for Health from the Health Select Committee on 3rd July. The Council received publicity and positive feedback from the press for its position and the Chief executive of North Tees and Hartlepool NHS Trust Ian Dalton said: "We await the outcome of that referral, and we note that Stockton Council appreciates that running identical services on both our North Tees and Hartlepool sites is not viable." This position could not be agreed at the Joint Health Scrutiny Committee which made its own referral on 6th July.

Health Scrutiny Support Programme

Linda Phipps, North East Programme Advocate is liaising with the Scrutiny Officer to provide up to 4 days of support to the Health Select Committee and the Chair and Vice-Chair of Children and Young People, and Adults, Leisure and Culture Select Committees as they have social care responsibilities, around the following three areas.
