## **Update on Progress (including issues/problems/successes)**

#### **Review of Tobacco Control**

The tripartite meeting was held on 20 April. The review is in two phases, firstly regulation and enforcement then health issues. The scope and project plan for phase one was agreed by the Committee on 26 April 2012.

The main issues

Smoking remains the single preventable cause of premature death in the UK today. Around half of long-term smokers will eventually die as a result and approximately 15 people a day die in the North East alone. Stockton is significantly higher than the national average for the number of smoke related deaths each year.

The overall aim / objectives in doing this work is:

- To examine the supply of tobacco including:
- Enforcement measures against illegal trading in tobacco;
- Under-age sales and the sales of smuggled and counterfeit cigarettes

The Committee will meet with the following before the August recess to gather evidence:

- Trading Standards
- Environmental Health
- Neighbourhood Enforcement
- Licensing/Noise
- CFYA
- FRESH NE
- Police
- HMRC

# **Review of Community Safety and Security Services**

The Committee agreed the action plan for the recently completed EIT review which showed that three of the four recommendations were completed. Only the reduction in the contribution to the Cleveland Emergency Planning Unit was outstanding awaiting Hartlepool Council raising the necessary invoices to complete the final recommendation.
