Accountability of local health services

Regulation, inspection and scrutiny

NHS England

- Authorise, fund and monitor CCGs
- Commission some services inc. primary care and specialised, and some public health on behalf of PHE
- Accountable to Sec. of State for Health

Department of Health

- Allocate public health funding
- Public Health England (PHE) established as an Executive Agency

Care Quality Commission (CQC)

- Regulator and inspectorate responsible for ensuring quality and safety standards are met across all providers of care and health

Monitor

- Ensure competition is in the patient interest and based on quality
- Promote efficiency, and set prices

HealthWatch England

- Independent
- Lead Local HW, and raise any concerns at highest level

Quality Surveillance Groups

- networks of commissioners, inspectors, and regulators

Durham, Darlington and Tees NHS Area Team

- Also includes input into emergency planning, service reconfigurations

NHS Hartlepool and Stockton Clinical Commissioning Group (CCG)

- Responsible for commissioning the majority of local health services
- Comprised of local GPs
- Leads on local service re-design

Health and Wellbeing Board

Co-ordination of health and social care

- Oversee JSNA and Health and Wellbeing Strategy
- Forum to discuss re-configuration
- Promote integrated approaches and joint commissioning, where appropriate
- Public health

Local HealthWatch

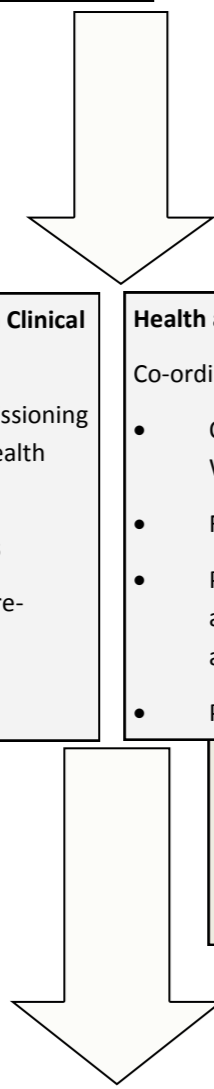
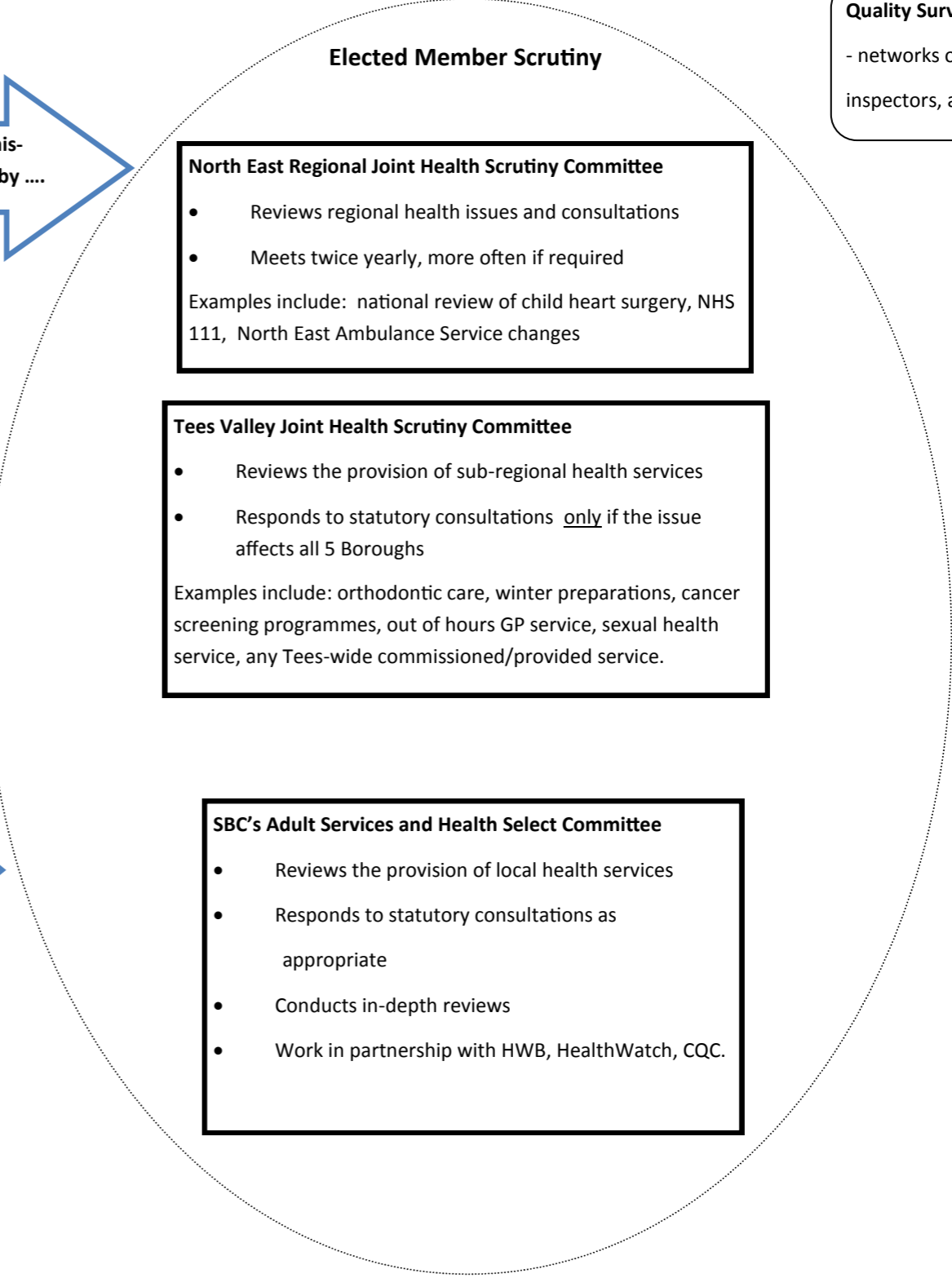
- Independent, community voice
