To agree to the submission of the Regeneration and Environment Local Plan to the Secretary of State for independent examination, to endorse the associated evidence base and to agree any amendments to the RELP before submission. The Regeneration and Environment Local Plan is the site allocations plan to deliver the adopted Core Strategy. It also contains some strategic policies relating to the distribution of housing sites, the provision of infrastructure and a policy in favour of sustainable development. Before the policies contained in the RELP can be implemented in the determination of planning applications, it must be examined by an inspector appointed by the Secretary of State to determine if the plan is sound. This report seeks the agreement of Cabinet to submit the RELP and its associated evidence base to the Secretary of State so that an examination can be arranged. It also seeks Cabinet's endorsement of any proposed changes to the plan, resulting from the Publication consultation held between February and March 2015.
