Better Health Programme –This programme of acute services reconfiguration is now a key part of the local Sustainability and Transformation Plan (STP).

The statutory Joint Committee has been formed by all seven affected Authorities (including North Yorkshire) in order to consider and respond to the consultation. In advance of the formal consultation, the Committee will be reviewing the public feedback to date, plans for consultation, and the development of the options appraisal process. The Committee is now named the STP Joint Health Scrutiny Committee.

This met on 8 November and local authority chief officers were invited to provide input. Concerns were expressed about engagement with local authorities and the impact on local planning.

The Committee was informed that the planned consultation relating to major hospital changes was not now due to go ahead in 2018.

National Review of Congenital Heart Disease

The new National Review includes services for adults, and the services provided at Newcastle Hospitals Trust. Newcastle will be able to continue to provide CHD services including surgery should they be able to meet the new standards in a given timescale.
