REPORT OF THE DEPUTY CHIEF EXECUTIVE

SCRUTINY WORK POGRAMME 2018/19 – MID YEAR UPDATE

SUMMARY

The report provides an update on the delivery of the scrutiny work programme for 2018/19.

RECOMMENDATION

That the report be noted.

DETAIL

- 1. The programme of in-depth scrutiny reviews was set by Executive Scrutiny Committee in March 2018. At the outset, it was acknowledged that this was a challenging programme which would need to be completed ahead of the purdah period prior the 2019 local elections with no flexibility for reviews to straggle across municipal years as had been the practice. In addition, each of the five Select Committees had already commenced a review from the previous year and this work continued into the current year.
- 2. Executive Scrutiny Committee asked for a mid-year update on delivery of the programme. The table below sets out all the in-depth scrutiny review work by Select Committee and also summarises the other work which is carried out alongside the reviews and forms the full work programme for the year.
- 3. The Scrutiny Team have been working towards completion of the full programme by February 2019 and it is now the intention for all reviews to report to February Cabinet at the latest. In order to complete the programme, some reviews are being conducted by task and finish group running alongside full Select Committee reviews. In addition, in scoping several of the reviews, it was clear that a full in-depth scrutiny review was no longer required and instead update reports were considered by Select Committees.
