Key Issues / Problems or concerns	Sustainability and Transformation Plan (STP) / Integrated Care System (ICS)
	The statutory Joint Committee has been formed by all seven affected Authorities (including North Yorkshire) in order to consider proposals emanating from the STP/ Integrated Care System process.

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	The Joint Committee last met in June and received an update on the development of the ICS. It was reported that the regional Trusts were still to come to a clinical consensus on options for the shape of some services.  CCG Mergers  The Committee was consulted on the proposals for merging Clinical Commissioning Groups in the Durham and Tees areas, at the meeting in July. The preferred option of the CCGs is to establish one CCG for County Durham, and one for the Tees Valley.  Skerne Medical Group, Sedgefield  This GP Practice has registered patients from the Wynyard area and a base in Sedgefield. The Practice faced a substantial shortage of GP sessions from February 2019 and assessed options for the future. The relevant CCG has approved plans to close a branch surgery in Trimdon Village. The Practice is now undertaking a further consultation with patients and details have been circulated. Durham Council's Health Committee will continue to monitor future developments.  Repeat Prescriptions
	The Committee has requested further details on the introduction of changes to how repeat prescription are requested. This change will be introduced from September. For most patients, community pharmacies will no longer be able to order repeat medication for patients. Patients will instead order their medication directly from their GP practice.
Requests for more information	The STP Committee will receive information on the development of Primary Care Networks at a future meeting.
