Members commended the work of the service during an extremely challenging 2020-2021 and felt that it was a highly-organised department within the Council whose activity a large proportion of the public may not fully understand – as such, it was proposed that its work was publicised more widely (e.g. Stockton News) which may also aid in encouraging and reinforcing the reporting of concerns / issues for follow-up. <u>Community Services and Transport</u> The Committee considered information in relation to crime and anti- social behaviour, hate crime, asylum and migration, the Civic Enforcement Service, and the Security and Surveillance Service. Members were pleased to see the very encouraging overall reduction in local crime incidents and commended the work of the various services outlined who operate at the 'coal-face' of local life. In addition, the service areas highlighted link into a number of partnerships the Local Authority prides itself on, and credit was due for keeping these going in the current climate, as well as maintaining contact / visibility with the public and adapting to new ways of working. It was also pleasing to see the Hate Crime agenda moving forward.
