Achieved since last meeting	The Select Committee approved the scope and project plan for the review which is seeking to understand what funding is available and whether this meets the needs of Stockton residents. The scrutiny review will also examine what work is taking place across the Tees Valley to create a local workforce fit for the demands of a green economy of the future with specific focus on capacity to delivery home energy efficiency measures in Stockton. The Committee will undertake the following key lines of enquiry: What financial support is currently available nationally and locally to help with home energy efficiency? Does this support reflect the needs of Stockton households taking into account our property base? What as been the take-up of funding available? What are the requirements for registered social landlords and private landlords to ensure a minimum energy efficiency standard within their housing stock? What opportunities are there for collaboration with key partners and the community? Are relevant courses offered by local education providers? What potential other courses could be offered if there was more demand? What is being done to encourage young people to consider education/training and careers in new and expanding green industries? What loans or grants are available to support adult education and training in green jobs? What work is taking place with business to understand local skills shortages in green industries?
