PARTNERSHIP MINUTES – JANUARY MEETINGS

SUMMARY

The Board has previously agreed that the Chairs of the Adults Health and Wellbeing Partnership and Children and Young People's Partnership will provide a short covering report with Partnership minutes.

DETAIL

Adults' Health and Wellbeing Partnership – 5 January 2016

Fire Service as a Health Asset

The Partnership received a presentation from Cleveland's Chief Fire Officer. The presentation asserted that there were opportunities for the Brigade, working closely with partners, to use collective capabilities and resources more effectively and to enhance intelligence led early intervention and prevention. This could help people to sustain their independence for longer and, in so doing, reduce preventable hospital admissions and deaths. Members noted that the Fire Services targeted Home Fire Safety visits had seen almost an 80% reduction in primary fires over a period of 10 years.

It was agreed that a Task and Finish Group be constituted to plan how this initiative would be taken forward. The Task and Finish group is scheduled to meet in March.

At this meeting the Partnership also received reports/information on the following:

Children and Young People's Partnership – 20 January 2016

Early Help Update

The Partnership received the Early Help Update report. The Board received and discussed the same report, at its meeting held on 26 January.

Domestic Abuse Analysis Report

The Partnership received a Domestic Abuse Analysis Report and there was particular discussion on Operation Encompass. Additionally, the Partnership discussed the feasibility of information being gathered and shared, by the Police, about domestic violence incidents, where pregnant women are identified at the scene. This was being considered.

The Partnership also heard that an event was being arranged, to take place, in March, that would give partners the opportunity to contribute to a refresh of the Domestic Violence Action Plan.
