SEND Draft Joint Commissioning Strategy

1. The Group continued its role in helping to develop a SEND Joint Commissioning Strategy. The draft SEND Strategy is presented at this meeting elsewhere on the agenda.

Adult Carers' Support Service Update and Time Out Service Delivery Model

2. The Commissioning Group agreed that the Time Out Service should remain 'in house' until March 2019, to allow further collection of usage data and analysis of that data.

Funding of Stroke Association

3. It was agreed that the Stroke Recovery contract be extended until March 2019 in order for joint work to be undertaken between the Council and CCG.

Stockton Carers' Support

4. The Partnership received a presentation relating to the Stockton Carers' Support Service, which the Council was now providing in-house. It was agreed that the new service provided an opportunity for partners to re-engage and many links were

highlighted at the meeting for further discussion at a later date.

Smoking Cessation

5. The Partnership received an update on Smoking Cessation and were pleased to note that recent Public Health England findings supported the Partnership's view that the use of e-cigarettes was a useful tool to assist people to stop smoking, when used in conjunction with behavioural support.
