REPORT OF RELEVANT CHAIRS

HEALTH AND WELLBEING UPDATE

SUMMARY

This report provides a brief overview of discussions at a meeting of the Adults Health and Wellbeing Partnership. The report also has appended to it a copy of the minutes of the Domestic Abuse Steering Group meeting held on 13 June 2019.

DETAIL

Adults' Health and Wellbeing Partnership - 6 June 2019 - Appendix 1

Developing a Physical Activity Strategic Framework

- 1. Members were reminded that, following a Physical Activity Peer Review, a strategic framework for Physical Activity had been developed. That framework was presented to the Partnership at this meeting, for consideration.
- 2. The Partnership endorsed the framework and agreed to recommend, to the Health and Wellbeing Board, that a Strategy Group be established to develop an Action Plan and oversee the implementation of the framework.
- 3. The Partnership had been unable to identify a strategic lead, and chair, for the Group. It was suggested that the Health and Wellbeing Board may have some thoughts in this regard and on the reporting lines of the Group.
- 4. Establishment of the Strategy Group would be the subject of a future report to the Board.

JSNA – Armed Forces Community and Cardio Vascular Disease

- 5. The Partnership signed off, for publication, the JSNAs for Armed Forces Community and Cardio Vascular Disease.
- 6. With regard to the Armed Forces Community, the Partnership discussed the lack of robust data and identified some potential sources that would be looked

into.

- 7. In terms of CVD, discussion included :
 - The NHS Health Checks and the targeting of high risk groups and those from deprived areas. Members highlighted the link between poverty/low income and stress/hypertension.
 - Partners recognized that trends, in Stockton, were moving in the right direction and early mortality rates were not significantly higher than the England average.

NHS Forward Plan Update

- The Partnership received a presentation relating to the NHS's Long Term Plan 2019 – 2029 (the Board received a similar presentation, at its meeting in January).
- 9. There was a lengthy discussion and, amongst other things, Members recognized that it would be important that health agencies worked closely with all partners, to deliver the plan and that there would be potential for the Stockton locality to design services that met its own needs and would be opportunities to be innovative and work differently. The Health and Wellbeing Board would have an important and central role in facilitating this.

Domestic Abuse Steering Group – 13 June 2019 – Appendix 2

Everyone's Business

- 10. The Steering Group was provided with a presentation, from Everyone's Business, relating to addressing Domestic Abuse at Work.
- 11. It was noted that 'Everyone's Business' worked with employers to tackle domestic abuse, by providing the necessary tools to recognize the signs and play an active role in prevention.
- 12. It was suggested that any work needed to link in with the Better Health at work programme (BHAW). Representatives were asked to take the 'Everyone's Business' offer back to their organisations and decide if they wished to explore further.
