





Infection rates













North East

7-Day Cases (PHE - Pillars 1 & 2) by UTLA





Key information

- Stockton-on-Tees currently has the 4th highest 7-day infection rate in the North East
- Stockton-on-Tees rate has decreased in the last 4 weeks and in the last 7 days
- Newcastle, North Tyneside and Middlesbrough have seen an increase in rate compared to 4 weeks ago
- Vaccination uptake in Stockton-on-Tees is higher than the national average





- Community transmission. Rates more vulnerable to fluctuation now cases are lower
- Some household transmission (between / within)
- Cases across age groups but mostly young people / school children; >60s v. low rates
- Some remaining outbreaks across key settings but much reduced (some workplaces, education; but care homes now v few)
- Reduced impact on hospitals
- Prevention and response activity continues future-proofing and forward planning, learning from national pilots e.g. support for isolation



Communications & engagement

- Hands, face, space, fresh air
- Testing, isolation and support
- Support to vaccine comms: take the vaccine when offered; continue adhering to control measures
- Things are not yet 'normal'
- Community Champions now >100, representing a range of communities & backgrounds
 - Reach into communities re: vaccine, testing & perceptions / risk re: Covid





Vaccine inequalities

- Inequalities plan lead by CCG
- Clinics for asylum seeker & migrant population; homeless population; planning approach to areas of greater deprivation / workplaces
- 'Evergreen' offer
- Priority: 2nd dose; and cohorts 1-9 (move from 12 to 8 weeks)



Testing & tracing

Asymptomatic testing

- 6 new community-based testing centres ongoing work to promote uptake; also targeted testing offer linked with support offer in communities
- 47 community Collect locations, uptake good
- Flexibility of local offer is key increasing national emphasis
- National pilots of 'test to release'

Contact tracing

- Local-0 going well all cases now followed up locally
- Resourcing longer term is needed & PH system is changing



Variants of Concern

- National & local processes re: surge testing
- Indian variant
 - High rate of increase but actual numbers low close ongoing monitoring
 - Impact on vaccine effectiveness still needs to be understood
 - Key is how far variant is more transmissible than 'Kent' variant
 - Continued importance of vaccine & testing
 - Strong national approach to genome sequencing positive tests, to detect variant cases





- Ongoing support to local businesses as progress along roadmap
- Supportive visits & warning / enforcement activity where required, majority of local businesses compliant
