Council Plan 2015-18 – Environment and Housing Theme - A clean, green Stockton-on-Tees with appropriate housing provision – Objective - Address the housing requirements of the borough

What are the main issues and overall aim of this review?

Main issues:

Choice Based Lettings (CBL) has been in operation locally since 2009 as part of the Tees Valley wide 'Compass' scheme. It enables people on the social housing waiting list to 'bid' for properties suitable for their needs. Since its early development there have been extensive shifts in the housing market and housing policy, particularly relating to welfare reform.

Registered Housing Providers are experiencing varying demand for their housing stock at the same time as demand for private rented options is rising significantly. Varying demand is affecting the number of times a void property is offered to new tenants and the void-to-re-let timescales.

Overall aims of review:

- To ensure that access to social housing remains fair and equitable, and responds to changing patterns of demand

- To ensure best use of the Borough's Housing Stock and minimise void timescales.

The review would not examine the Allocations Policy, but alternatives to the Choice Based Lettings method of delivery and in particular the method used to advertise and bid for

properties.

The Committee will undertake the following key lines of enquiry:

- Choice Based Lettings – what are the aims and how does it operate?

- what is the current social housing stock situation in the Borough?

- what is the impact of welfare reform on the need and demand for social housing?

- what are the main issues / concerns regarding how CBL is operating?

- what lessons can be taken from other housing providers – why is the private sector particularly attractive at this time? What are our partnering Registered Providers doing to increase demand for social housing?

- what are the alternatives to the current CBL scheme / how can it be improved?

Who will the Committee be trying to influence as part of its work?

To report to Cabinet in October in order to feed into wider Tees Valley review.
