BIFF brief history

Billingham International Folklore Festival is the largest traditional international dance and music Festival in UK and is unique in presenting a variety of world-class traditional cultures to British Audiences.







Billingham International Folklore Festival was originally founded in **1965** with a Partnership between Billingham Urban District Council and Voluntary Organisations in Billingham to provide entertainment and colour to what was then a new town centre.

BIFF brief history





From small beginnings - only Austria, Estonia and Hungary were represented at the first festival, the festival has gradually evolved over the years to become the unique Festival it is now.

In 1999 it became a limited Company and a Registered Charity the same year and is completely organised and run by volunteers.

During the 53 years Billingham International Folklore Festival has played host to over 20000 international artists from 97 countries of the World and was attended by over 1 million people.

In 1970 Billingham International Folklore festival became one of the 8 founder members of the World-wide Organisation — CIOFF (International Council of Organisations of Folklore Festivals and Folk Art), which at present includes over 100 countries of the World, representing over 300 International Festivals and over 50000 International traditional dance and music groups world-wide. CIOFF is an NGO in formal associate partnership with UNESCO, accredited to provide advisory services for Convention.

Billingham Festival is one of the three most prestigious and well-known festivals in the World, with the other two being Festival de Confolens (France) and Drummonville Festival (Canada).

















The annual SBC grant goes to cover the basic main festival expenses:
