Reaching out to BAME-led businesses

Thank you for taking part in an interview with Marketwise Strategies, in June, as part of initial research for Tees Valley Combined Authority's (TVCA's) BAME Business Engagement Programme. I would like now to ask for your help again. As ever, your support will be vital in helping to shape future activities and the business support offer locally, to businesses in the BAME community.

Over the next few weeks, the research will move into a second phase, which will include:

I have attached some wording that we would like you to use when contacting those businesses to request their help. This includes an explanation of the ways in which the survey responses will be used, confidentiality safeguards and the reasons why TVCA has commissioned this work.

We are making this request for help to each of the five local authorities in the Tees Valley. Marketwise Strategies will contact selected businesses, and ask them to complete an online survey within three to four days. This will begin from Friday 19th November.
