





# S ketch Elevation Treatment.

#### APPEAL AT SUPREME KNITWEAR, NEW STREET, THORNABY, STOCKTON-ON-TEES

Thank you for your recent correspondence which has been passed to me for investigation. I deal with post decision complaints and queries. Please accept my sincere apologies for the delay in replying to you.

I note your concern over the lack of consistency in the decision making on these 3 applications and the confusion your planning department now feels over which decision carries more weight in future planning applications. We have also received a similar query from Jeremy Good the agent for appeal number 2102926 directed to Katrine Sporle, Chief Executive for the Planning Inspectorate, and I have enclosed a copy of her reply for your information.

In respect of Inspector David Cullingford's case it has been accepted that the reasoning was poor and should, therefore, not be seen as setting a precedent for future planning applications. We do try to ensure that all our decisions are of a consistently high standard, but it is apparent that this has not happened on this occasion and for that we can only apologise unreservedly.

#### APPEAL AT SUPREME KNITWEAR, NEW STREET, THORNABY, STOCKTON-**ON-TEES**

Thank you for your letter of 21 April, please accept my apologies for the delay in replying.

Having read the decisions including those relating to costs, it is clear that we have failed to apply a consistent approach when applying Stockton-on-Tees Borough Council's Interim Student Accommodation Policy Document (ISAPD).

Paragraph 6.4 of PPS12 is clear and unambiguous in the advice that councils should not produce any other type of planning guidance other than a Supplementary Planning Document. It also goes on to refer to the need for proper consultation in formulating such documents. In reference to the two appeal decisions it seems that Harold Stephen's has applied this approach correctly (APP/H0738/A/09/2102926).

As a result of this I am also copying this letter to the Stockton-on-Tees Borough Council advising that they should not treat the reasoning in relation to the ISAPD in David Cullingford's case as forming a precedent for the basis of other decisions in the future.

I accept that this was a poor piece of reasoning on the Inspector's behalf for which I can only apologise. We do try to ensure that all decisions are of a consistently high standard, but this case falls below the standards we have set ourselves. I have also taken responsibility to ensure that the appropriate lessons are learnt from this case.
