PARTNERSHIP STRATEGIC ASSESSMENT AND COMMUNITY SAFETY PLAN

- 1. Members will be aware that we will be producing our first Partnership Strategic Assessment in January 2008. A draft of the layout of how this document will look is attached at Appendix 1.
- 2. It is proposed that we use data from April to September 2007 for the first Partnership Strategic Assessment as we have taken a comprehensive look at crime and anti social behaviour data and trends over at least three years in the Tackling Crime and Disorder Audit 2007. This document is our main consultation mechanism and is delivered to every door in the Borough, available on www.saferstockton.com and at public reception points. The high level of responses (over 4,000) has enabled us to set priorities based on local needs.
- 3. We have discussed the priorities chosen in Agenda Item Number 7. It is proposed that the Community Safety Plan will follow the same format as the Partnership Strategic Assessment but will contain more detail on actions, ownership and targets. This plan will be updated yearly and we will consider new issues coming out of our Face the People sessions, Neighbourhood Policing and the Strategic Assessment process. Having an Emerging Issues priority will enable us to incorporate changing trends and add focus where needed.
- 4. Members are asked to consider whether our second Partnership Strategic Assessment should be produced on an annual basis alongside of the Police Strategic Intelligence Assessment linking in to their production cycle and whether it should be one partnership document or two separate pieces of work.
- 5. The Partnership Strategic Assessment and a draft of the Community Safety Plan will be brought to our next meeting on the 29 January 2008.
- 6. Members are asked to consider the issues at point 4:
 - a) Should we produce our second Partnership Strategic Assessment in line with the cycle set for the Police Strategic Intelligence Assessment?
 - b) Should we have one shared Partnership document?
