
Violence in Stockton April to October 2008 Report to inform in depth discussion on Violence Safer Stockton Partnership 16 December 2008


The following report details all violence against the person offences which have occurred in the Borough between 01/04/08 to 31/10/08. In total there have been 1,781 offences within this time period, which is a reduction of 15% on the 2,094 offences recorded over the same time period last year. Three offences make up 83% of all recorded violence against the person and there were 50 offences classified as Most Serious Violence as per National Indicator 15 (1 x Murder, 1 x Attempted Murder, 25 x Wounding with intent to do GBH and 23 x Inflicting grievous bodily harm, without intent. The table below shows the three main offence categories and the change over the two years.

Of the 1,781 offences that have occurred between April and October 2008, 1,263 (71%) of these were committed between the hours of 6pm and 6am, which relates to the night time economy. In fact, 22% of all violence occurred on a Friday or Saturday night between the hours of 10pm and 3am (12% on Friday night and 10% on Saturday night), and a quarter of all MSV crimes occurred between these times. Only 518 (29%) were committed between the hours of 6am to 6 pm in the daytime. The graphs below show the hour of the day and day of the week that offences occurred.



There was a peak of offences in May 08 which related to the two bank holidays. There were 50 offences just for Sunday 25th and Monday 26th of May 2008, which was the second bank holiday weekend of the month. The graph below shows a breakdown of violence by month, and demonstrates that reductions in violence on the previous year have been getting better as the year progresses.




A total of 492 of offences (28%) were Domestic Violence (467 of these were flagged as Domestic in the crime data and the remaining 25 were identified as Domestic through further analysis). The domestic offences also occurred more frequently at night time (348, 72% off all domestic violence) as opposed to the day time hours (144, 28% off all domestic violence) and 71% occurred at a dwelling. The most common form of domestic violence was assault occasioning actual bodily harm (222, 45%) followed by common assault and battery (218, 44%). Overall 93% (455) of domestic offences involved actual violence with only 37 offences of threats and harassment, although only 4 offences were classed as Most Serious Violence.

There were 163 offences (9% overall) which were committed at a licensed premise (148 flagged in the crime data, with an additional 15 identified by further analysis). 152 of these offences occurred during night time hours, which is 12% of all night time violence. 12 of the 50 (24%) MSV crimes were committed at licensed premises.

There were 465 offences (26% overall) where the 'committed under the influence' flag was positively attributed, although a further 516 (29%) were flagged as unknown. Of those which were committed under the influence 406 (87%) occurred at night time, which is 32% of all night time violence. 15 of the 50 (30%) MSV crimes were committed under the influence.

Not surprisingly the majority of offences have occurred in Stockton Town Centre ward and around the High Street and Yarm Lane area in particular. The map and chart below give a full breakdown by ward. The wards have been colour coded to show variance from the Borough average. Red is more than twice the Borough average, amber is between half above and twice above the Borough average, and darkest green is less than half the Borough average and mid green somewhere close to the average. The blue stars show the locations where offences classed as Most Serious Violent crimes (MSV) have occurred.

The following table provides a full breakdown of both day time and night time violence by ward and looks at the differences between the position of each ward when ranked from most violence to least violence. Most notably Parkfield and Oxbridge and Billingham North are ranked much higher for night time violence than day time, and Billingham East and Bishopsgarth and Elmtree ranked higher for daytime violence than they do for night time violence.

During the reporting period there have been 62 crimes that contained the word 'knife', of which 36 were possession offences. Only eight of these offences resulted in injury to the victim and most others were used to make threats.
