Community Safety Plan - future of priority 6

- 1. Members will recall from our meeting on 3rd February that the partnership discussed the second Partnership Strategic Assessment and that the recommendations within it were endorsed.
- 2. The PSA showed clearly that Other Theft remains an area of concern for us and that the categories that we have included in the term are still relevant:
 - a) Shoplifting
 - b) Theft of metals
 - c) Theft of personal belongings such as mobile phones and wallets
 - d) Theft of wheelie bins
 - e) Theft of pedal cycles
 - f) Theft of garden furniture
- 3. It is therefore proposed that we continue to have Other Theft as our sixth priority.
- 4. The target in the Community Safety Plan is for a 3% reduction in 2009/10 to 4,190. The attached monitoring report shows that we are on target to achieve the 3% reduction for 2008/09 it is therefore proposed that the target for 2009/10 is endorsed.
- 5. Members are asked to recommend:
 - a) That we retain Other Theft as our sixth key priority under Emerging Issues
 - b) That we aim for the 3% reduction for 2009/10 proposed in the Community Safety Plan.
