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What is your role? (Info for Neighbourhood Officers)

This is part of my plan to get in touch with all children and young people across the Force area and relies on the enthusiasm, participation and support of all Neighbourhood Officers working within their designated ward.

Your role, as a Neighbourhood Officer is to help make this happen by:

- Making contact with all schools in your ward before the end of term
- Launch the competition with children and young people in your ward
- To support schools/ teachers/ individuals throughout the competition period by providing ideas, dates, rules and templates etc (all of which are in this pack)
- Providing advice and information on community and personal safety issues "Keeping People Safe @ Christmas"
- To co-ordinate entries from your ward and with the head teacher (or other representative from the school) judge entries for those designs to go onto the next stage
- To ensure Competition Co-ordinator, Lorraine Miller (contact details attached) is kept updated regarding schools contacted and entries received.
- To ensure that all Entry Record Forms are accurately completed to accompany entries and ensure winning entries are sent to police headquarters for judging
- To ensure certificates are presented to each school that enters.

All dates, supporting information and a flowchart of the stages of the competition are enclosed in this briefing pack.

All Neighbourhood Chief Inspectors need to ensure updates are sent to the Competition Co-ordinator about which officers have contacted which schools. The Competition Co-ordinator can then circulate a weekly update to all Chief Inspectors and the Art of Safety working group members.

Your contribution to this project will make a positive impact in promoting both this competition and Neighbourhood Policing.

Introduction (Info for children & young people)

Cleveland Police is running a competition! Over the next few months you will see officers like us visiting your school or walking within your community.

This is an art competition. We want the children & young people of Cleveland to create a piece of artwork that will promote "Keeping People Safe @ Christmas"

Anyone between the ages of 5 and 14 years of age can enter, and your entry might be used as the Force's Christmas card. Your finished picture will be seen across the whole of Cleveland, this includes Redcar & Cleveland, Middlesbrough, Stockton and Hartlepool!

Ideas (Info for children & young people)

To be in with a chance of winning the art competition, think carefully about what the artwork that you are creating will show, and who will see it. The title of the competition is "**Keeping People Safe @ Christmas**". How could you show this in your art work?

Your picture should show how to keep people safe within Cleveland; make you feel proud to be a part of your local area and your community. Think about what makes people feel unsafe, such as crime, drug use and especially anti-social behaviour. How would your picture encourage people to keep others safe at Christmas?

Dates & Prizes (Info for Neighbourhood Officers & Schools)

Neighbourhood Chief Inspectors need to let Lorraine Miller (Competition Co-ordinator) know which Neighbourhood Officers are visiting which schools by **2nd July 2010.**

Neighbourhood Officers must make **initial contact** with all primary and secondary schools about the competition before 16th July 2010 and let Lorraine Miller know who will be and who won't be entering by 19th July 2010.

Neighbourhood Officers must visit schools after the summer holidays and **confirm** with Lorraine Miller which schools **are entering** by <u>27th September 2010</u>.

Each key stage group in each school will be judged by the Head teacher (or other nominated school rep) and Neighbourhood Officer by 1st November 2010.

The Entry Record Form (Page 8) must be faxed to Lorraine Miller (fax: 0845 271 3880) by <u>1st</u>

<u>November 2010</u>. This Entry Record Form must then be attached to the original winning entries from each key stage group in each school.

All Neighbourhood Policing Teams need to get all winning entries (and Entry Record Forms) from each key stage group in each school to Helen Devine (PA to Mrs Hall) at Cleveland Police Headquarters by 2nd November 2010.



The winner from each key stage group in each school will receive:

- The Chief Constable's Certificate of Merit
- The School will also receive a Certificate for their contribution

All of the winning entries from the 3 key stage groups from each school will be judged to pick an overall winner from each age group on <u>5th November 2010</u> at Cleveland Police Headquarters.

The Presentation Evening will take place on <u>22nd November 2010</u>.

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The winner from each key stage group across the Cleveland Police area will receive:

- A personally engraved Nano iPod
- The Chief Constable's Certificate of Merit
 - £500 for their school
- A framed poster of their winning design



2 runners up from each key stage group across the Cleveland Police area will receive:

- An iPod Shuffle
- The Chief Constable's Certificate of Merit
- A laminated poster of their winning design

From the winners of each key stage group across the Cleveland Police area, the overall competition winner will be chosen!



The overall winner of the art competition will be awarded:

- A £50 I Tunes Voucher
- £1000 for their school
- A visit to their school by the Cleveland Police helicopter!!
 - A framed A3 poster of their winning design
 - A pack of Christmas Cards of their winning design
- PLUS their design will be used as the Force Christmas Card!!

All winning entries from each stage of the art competition will be displayed within special exhibitions across the Cleveland Police area.

- \bullet Anyone from key stage 1, 2 and 3 (5 14 years of age) from a school can enter the competition.
- Entries MUST be submitted on the Template provided
- Make sure you have put your full name, age, address and school name on the top of the template or your entry will not be judged!
