6.3 Increase the number of arrests from shoplifting identified through the councils control room, use 2008/09 to obtain a baseline figure for this category, then increase by 5% year on year. 2008/09 = 13 2009/10 = 10 Data From:- SBC Paul Leonard	One offence of Shoplifting was identified by the control room in Q1. Still time to increase and reach target.	☹		
6.4 Target Fly tipping operators and scrap dealers by increasing the number of planned operations from 7 in 2007/08 by 5% year on year. Data From:- SBC Marc Stephenson (ZHR + dedicated operations)	Five Dedicated operations conducted in the first quarter of this year with a dedicated team set up to concentrate on fly-tippers and waste carriers (scrap dealers).	☺		
6.5 All PPOs in the Community who continue to offend to have an ASBO/CRASBO package prepared by the Volume Crime Coordinator. Measured yearly against the PPO list Data From:- SBC Chris Dunwell	34 PPO's. Of the 20 PPO's that are in custody, one has an ASBO against them, there are currently no applications pending for PPO's in custody. Of the 14 PPO's in the community one has an ASBO placed on them with a variation pending. There are no other applications pending for PPO's in the community.	☺		
6.6 Reduce the number of people who continue to leave their wheelie bin out after receiving a section 46 by 5% year on year from a baseline taken from 2007/08 of 114, 2008/09 = 108, 2009/10 = 103, 2010/11 = 98 Data From:- SBC Claire Tait	In the 1st quarter 14 people have received a fixed penalty notice for continuing to leave their waste out on a non-collection day after receiving a Section 46 notice.	☺
