




- STP well received by those using the night-time economy








Door Staff at Pubs & Clubs




How do you rate the relationship between STP volunteers and the following? Members of the Public





- 34% reduction in arrests for drunkenness & disorderly offences

Police Comments



The Town Pastors have quickly built up a good rapport with the local door staff and drinkers within the town centre. A good relationship was also built up with officers on "Tranquillity" patrols, dealing with the night time economy and associated problems. Officers feel confident to ask the Town Pastors for help in dealing with vulnerable or drunk people they may come across and often use the hospitality facilities provided by the Town Pastors either for themselves or for referring people to for help.

They are not a police resource but are there to assist all agencies to help vulnerable members of society and offer them support and friendship.
